If your appeal is approved, you will be placed on SPECIAL

PROBATION. While on Special Probation a student:

- Is not allowed to study abroad, participate in NECCUM cross registration, CO-OP, Internships, Disney, etc.
- Is not allowed to take more than 8 credits during their first semester returning from suspension
- Is not allowed to take summer courses in the session immediately following spring term suspension*
- Is not allowed to register online
- Cannot register for the next semester until after grades are posted for the current semester
- Must follow their academic plan and participate in academic coaching
- Must complete the semester with a term GPA of 2.0.

*With the approval of the Director of Curriculum, Policy, and Assessment in collaboration with your academic advisor, students may be permitted to take a 12-week summer course and/or online courses.
